

Nursing Assistant/ Home Health Aide Training

When can I register for the course?

- You can register for the course once the course is listed. Deadline to register is 2 weeks prior to the first day of class.
- Once registered you can submit required forms you do not need to submit them to register.

How do I submit all of my required forms?

- You will be emailed a secure link to upload all of prerequisite documentation to. These forms need to be submitted prior to the start of class. You can use several apps on your smart phone such as notes to scan documents and upload to the link provided.
- We cannot accept emailed documents they must be uploaded via secure link.

How do I complete the CORI & SORI forms?

• A link will be emailed to you within 2 weeks before the start of class. You must fill out and submit we will verify your CORI/SORI in person or via zoom. Please do not have it notarized we will process the CORI/ SORI.

What will I need to have/prepare for the first day of class?

- You need to have your Prerequisite forms completed prior to the start of class

- Sign onto your Access BCC Account
- Complete CORI/ SORI Online
- Uniforms should be purchased within first few weeks of class you will not need them to start the class.

What kind of uniforms can we wear?

• Ceil blue (light blue) top and bottoms; we will provide you with a name badge



What type of shoes are acceptable?

• White nursing shoes/sneakers, no open backed shoes, no clogs

When are the clinics held?

- Clinical times and locations will be provided to you by the program coordinator when available. Clinical assignments are often held during the last weeks of the program (clinicals occur generally during the week for our weekday classes and during the weekend for our evening classes; schedules are subject to change
- The Program Coordinator will inform you of the clinical dates as soon as they are available.
- You will be required to attend a clinical orientation at the facility approximately one week before clinical begins; date is based on class schedule and facility availability
- All Clinical hours are mandatory and required for program completion

Are there any other items I am required to purchase?

- Items that are required to purchase are: The textbooks if applicable, ceil blue scrubs and white shoes. Book can be purchased at the BCC bookstore
- It is recommended to have a watch with a second hand, notebook for class, a small pocket notebook for clinical
